1. Enrollment and Administration

Information regarding enrollment procedures and tuition fees for the academic year 2026/2027 is available in the official university documents linked below. Students are encouraged to carefully consult the [Study Guidelines 26/27](#) and the [University Fee Regulations 26/27](#).

Once the enrollment in the Master programme has been formally accepted, students will be provided with:

- A university e-mail account
- A student matricola number
- A temporary password, which must be changed as soon as possible to ensure account security

The university e-mail address will be used for all official communications and administrative procedures, so it is essential to check it regularly.

2. Online Services and Platforms

- Wi-Fi Access (eduroam)

Once credentials are obtained, students gain access to the university Wi-Fi network. The network is named eduroam. Connection details are as follows:

- MyPage – Student Portal

Students can log in with their university credentials to a personal online portal called [MyPage](#). This platform allows you to monitor and manage many aspects of your academic career:

- Status of tuition payments

- Complete the study plan (not applicable for Erasmus students who already have a Learning Agreement)
- Check dates of all exam sessions and book exams
- Apply for student competitions within the university
- Access other university services

- **UdA App**

UdA App is the university's mobile application, available for Android and Apple devices. It is a faster and more convenient version of MyPage. Our advice is to check both platforms regularly!

- **E-Learning Platform**

The [E-learning platform](#) is used for uploading and sharing course materials. Professors typically use it to provide students with lecture slides, scientific articles, book chapters, and other materials necessary for exams.

- **Office 365**

Students also receive free access to [Office 365](#) using their university credentials.

- **UdaLibrary – Academic Journals**

Through connection to the university Wi-Fi system, students can access [UdaLibrary](#), which allows free consultation of many academic journals. To access it, click on the '**Proxy**' icon in the top-right corner of the page.

4. Italian Language

We strongly encourage all students to learn the basics of the Italian language. Even a basic knowledge of Italian will make it easier to navigate the campus and feel more confident in everyday university life. Moreover, if you are considering completing your Internship in Italy (see Section – TPV Internship), having some familiarity with the language will greatly enhance your experience, helping you communicate more effectively and integrate into the workplace. 5. Didactics

Attendance

This master's degree Programme does not require mandatory attendance. This means that students are not obliged to attend lectures in order to register for an exam. However, attending classes is strongly recommended because lectures help clarify course topics and provide guidance on the materials that will be part of the exam. The format and assessment methods of each exam are explained by the lecturer at the beginning of the course (see the [Course Catalogue](#) – UNICH for details).

Academic Calendar and Exam Sessions

The academic year in Italy is organized into two semesters. Exams are held in four sessions throughout the year. Each exam session usually includes three available exam dates (called appelli), which gives students multiple opportunities to take the same exam.

Session	Period	Notes
Winter Session	January / February	3 exam dates (appelli) available
Extraordinary Session	February / March	Max 3 pending exam
Summer Session	June / July	3 exam dates (appelli) available
April session	April	Limited availability
Autumnal Session	September	3 exam dates (appelli) available

N.B. The exams, in the extraordinary February–March session, are reserved for graduating students in the extraordinary sessions 2025–26 or 2026–27 who have a maximum of three pending exams. This means that not everyone can take advantage of these exam sessions.

Study Plan

Through the MyPage platform, every student must complete their study plan for the current academic year. The process involves:

- Confirming the mandatory courses required by the programme
- Selecting elective courses from those allowed within the curriculum

Once the study plan has been approved, students must independently register for exams.

Exam Registration and CFU

Exam registration is entirely managed by the student, using My page platform or Uda App. You can decide which exam session to register for and when to take the exam, without needing to inform the professor in advance (see the academic calendar below).

If you do not pass an exam, there is no need to worry. You can simply register for the next available exam date within the same session or wait for a later session. Having pending exams does not prevent you from continuing your studies or attending other courses. There is no resit exam procedure!

Important: All exams must be taken in person, as the programme does not offer an online examination option.

In the Italian university system, the weight of each course is measured in academic credits called CFU (Crediti Formativi Universitari). For this programme, students must complete 120 CFU in total in order to obtain their degree.

Final Thesis

For the final thesis, students are strongly encouraged to contact a lecturer as early as possible in order to request supervision for their thesis project. Students should therefore start thinking about their thesis topic and potential supervisor well before the final stage of their studies. 6. TPV – Practical Evaluative Internship

The TPV (Tirocinio Pratico Valutativo) is a compulsory practical internship required to complete the degree programme in psychology. It allows students to gain supervised professional experience and is necessary for obtaining the final degree.

Internship Options

When filling in the study plan, students must decide how and where their internship credits (CFU) will be employed and how these will be distributed. The available options are summarized in the table below:

Option	CFU	Description
External Internship (in Italy or abroad)	Up to 20 CFU	With an approved external supervisor / affiliated institution
Internal Internship	2, 4, or up to 6 CFU	With a psychology lecturer's lab at the university
Erasmus for Traineeship (Abroad)	Variable (depending on if student choose internal credits)	Mobility grants available; apply at least 3 months before start
Additional requirement*	+10 CFU	*Only for students whose Bachelor's degree is not Italian L-24

N.B. Students must complete 20 CFU in their Internship plan. However, they are free to manage them according to their interests. That is, when filling a study plan option could be: ex. 2CFU internally and the other 18 CFU external internship, 4CFU internally and the other 16CFU internally and so on... of course you can do all of the 20 CFU in an Organization and not benefit from laboratory collabs with one of our teacher. Remember to fill the study plan correctly.

Note that 1CFU = 25 hours.

Finding an Internship Supervisor

Students are personally responsible for finding their own internship supervisor (tutor). The university provides a list of approved supervisors and affiliated institutions where the internship can be carried out. Students can consult this list and contact one of the available tutors directly by email or phone to enquire about internship opportunities.

All detailed instructions, required steps, and administrative forms are available on the **official TPV Psychology website**, where students can find the procedures needed to secure an internship placement ([Affiliated Institution; Italian TPV steps](#)). These procedures apply to students who decide to carry out their internship **in Italy**, in any region.

Internship Abroad – Erasmus for Traineeship

Students who wish to complete their internship abroad must apply for the [Erasmus for Traineeship programme](#). Through this programme they can receive a mobility grant and complete an internship abroad that can later be recognised as a curricular internship within the degree programme.

Students must submit a request at least three months before the start of the traineeship to the designated academic committee ([Erasmus | Dipartimento di Psicologia](#)).

PPV – Evaluative Examination

At the end of the internship period, students must take the PPV (Prova Pratica Valutativa), an evaluative examination based on the internship experience and the skills developed during the training period. As with other exams, the PPV must be taken in person, as online examination is not available. Booking PPV dates follows the same steps as the exam reservation procedures. **N.B.** There are limited opportunities to take the PPV examination. Please choose according to your intention to complete your degree and refer to the academic calendar below.
